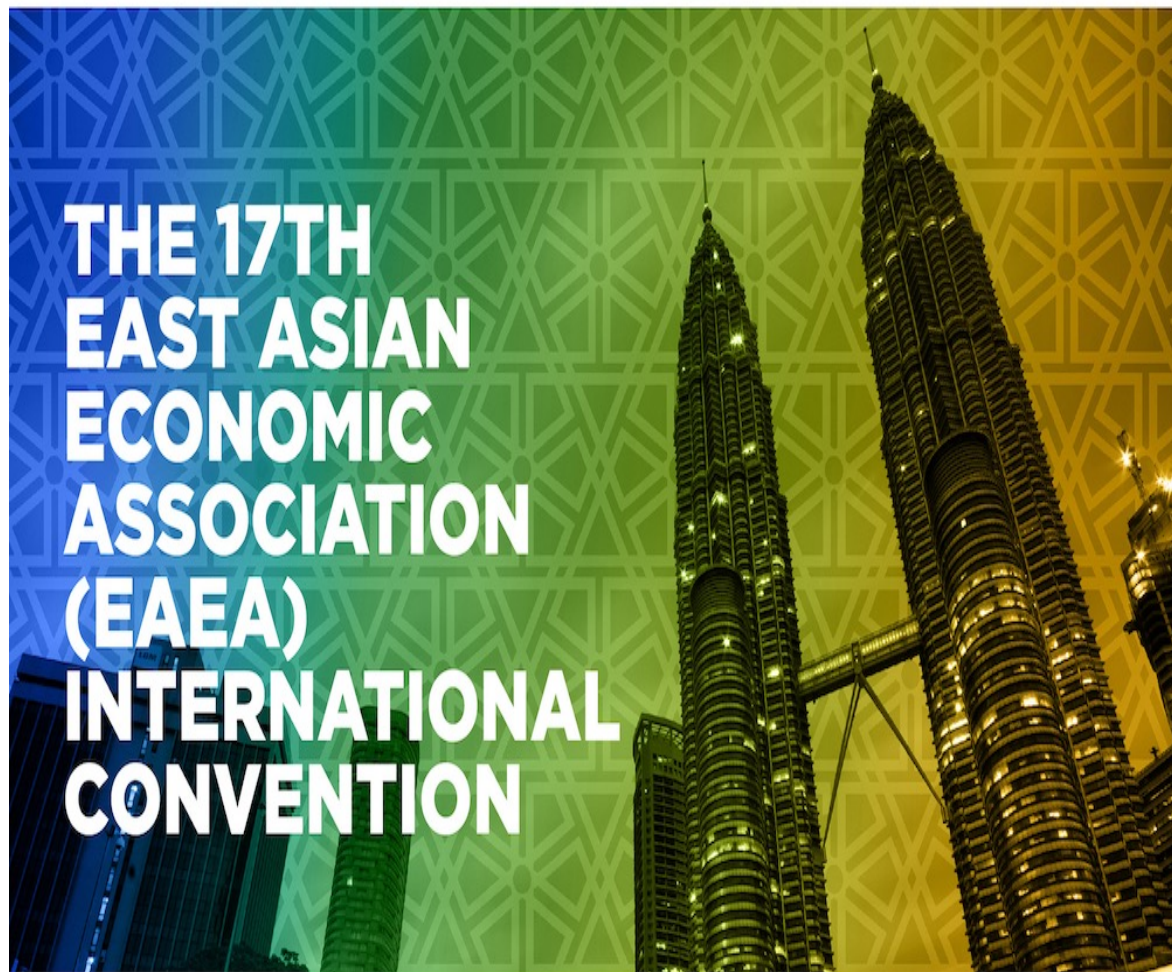

How to get to Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa from Sunway University?

On foot (approximately 20 minutes)

- Use the canopy walk from Sunway University (near Sunway College Cafeteria) and walk towards Sunway Pyramid Mall. Upon reaching the mall, walk towards the Skating Rink (**Jollibee Outlet as landmark**). From the Skating Rink, take the lift or escalator to the Ground Floor where there is a linkway to Sunway Resort Hotel and Spa. (**Din Tai Fung Restaurant as landmark**)

Elevated Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) (self-pay)

- The closest station would be from BRT SunU-Monash (can walk through Canopy walk at Mezzanine Floor, East Building, Sunway University) Take from SunU-Monash to BRT Sunway Lagoon station.

By using Sunway City Free Shuttle Service (25-minute frequency)

- Can take from Sunway University Foyer to Sunway Metro Commercial Centre. Delegates can choose to use **SUNWAY Shuttle Bus Tracker App** (download from App Store) to monitor the live location of the bus.

- Delegates may choose to use private vehicles or engage e-hailing services (Grab) from Sunway University (please use App).
